- ◆ To help protect your friends and neighbors from food borne illnesses that could cause death.
- ◆ Because all workers who handle food are required by state law to have a food handler certification.
- ◆ Volunteer Organizations that serve food from a temporary facility to the public must have a person in charge present at all times that food is being prepared and served. This person must have a food handler certification.
- ◆ Protect your volunteer organization or certified kitchen status from a negative event by learning to serve food
